Kennedy Challenges Joplin Crowd To "Show Me" by Electing Democrats

3-State Candidates Take Part in Rally Staged at Airport

Senator John F. Kennedy, Democratic presidential candidate, Saturday challenged a Four-State district crowd estimated at 25,000 persons to "show me in November '56" by electing Democratic leaders for the district and nation.

The Democratic standard bearer, arriving about an hour behind his scheduled arrival hour, spoke to a cheering crowd which completely filled the airport parking lot and spread over into the fields on the west side of the airport.

"I don't say the problems we face are easy, they're difficult, but I know we can do better than they're doing," Senator Kennedy said as the cheering-waving crowd shouted its approval.

Kennedy Seeks Report On Prestige

KANSAS CITY, Oct. 21 (AP)—Sen. John F. Kennedy challenged Vice President Richard Nixon today to show he would not allow a progressive movement which already showed the privilege of the United States as "all time low."

He referred to a survey of the situation and to have been conducted by the overseas offices of the United States Information Agency (USIA).

In a speech prepared for delivery here Kennedy said: "I challenge the United States administration and its willing agents to show the world facts known by having it made public."

Nixon, in the fourth Presidential debate with Kennedy Friday night, indicated it had been emphasized the first Sputnik this was in October, said Kennedy quoted Nixon as saying he would have no objection to having it made public.

"I am a presidential candidate who has been hammering at these three last night results in Africa and Latin America. They have damaged the image of the United States and it has been recognized as 'all time low.'"

He devoted most of his talk here to this charge. In Kansas City's Municipal Auditor, Kennedy received a delirious reception.

The vast hall, filled from ten p.m. on to the floor to the rafters, gave out a free atmosphere. A large proportion of the men dressed to be in voting gear.

Former President Harry S. Truman stood at the right. Earlier, he had invited the speaker to Kennedy at the dinner from Truman Center, a big slapping center in downtown Kansas City. All singing ended.
